INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM: GOALS

Board of Education

- For the purpose of making informed decisions, the Jordan-Elbridge School District Board of Education will monitor student achievement data a minimum of three times a school year.

District

- To systemically improve the district's PreK-12 math program as measured by student performance on 3-8 state tests, district quarterly exams, regents exams, the number of students performing at the aspirational rate, and the number of students earning an advanced designation diploma
- To systemically improve the district's PreK-12 ELA program as measured by student performance on 3-8 state tests, district quarterly exams, regents exams, the number of students performing at the aspirational rate, and the number of students earning an advanced designation diploma
- To provide expanded social work services to help students meet with academic success as measured by academic eligibility and graduation rates
- To provide students with the life-skills necessary to be college and career ready as measured by the graduation and aspirational rates
- To expand the systemic use of data to help guide district decisions as measured by the identification and articulation of specific metrics

HS Stretch Goals

- By 2020, the 4 year-graduation rate will be at or above 90%; in subsequent years, a 90% or higher graduation rate will be the institutional benchmark by which the success of the PreK-12 instructional program is measured.
- By 2020, 90% of the students will pass the CC Integrated Algebra class and regents exam by the end of their freshman year or earlier and 50% of every cohort will take and pass 3 math regents exams by the conclusion of the students' junior year.
- By 2020, 75% of every cohort will achieve at the aspirational rate on all CC regents exams as measured by earning a score of 75 or higher on the English exam and an 80 or higher on at least one math exam.

MS Stretch Goals

- By 2020, all students will demonstrate grade level or above reading and writing skills, grade level conceptual understandings in science, and grade level conceptual understandings and computational skills in math as measured by achieving proficiency on the NYS 5-8 tests and the district's quarterly exams in ELA and math.
- By 2020, the implementation of the MYP program will permeate the school culture and the program will be hosting site visits from schools seeking information about the IB.
- By 2020, 100% of the students in each 8th grade cohort will pass all their core area classes and enter the credit-bearing environment of high school ready to meet with success.

EE Stretch Goals

- By 2020, all students will demonstrate grade level ELA and math skills as measured by achieving proficiency on the district's quarterly exams and the NYS 3-4 tests.
- By 2020, all students will demonstrate grade level conceptual understandings in science as measured by achieving proficiency on the NYS grade 4 test.

GOALS FOR THE OPERATIONAL PROGRAM

Board of Education

- For the purpose of making informed decisions, the Jordan-Elbridge School District Board of Education will monitor the conditions of all facilities on an annual basis and request a report specific to facility usage at least twice a year.
- For the purpose of making informed decisions, the Jordan-Elbridge School District Board of Education will continue to provide financial oversight.

District

- To expand the systemic use of data to help guide district decisions as measured by the identification and articulation of specific metrics
- To develop a long-range financial model to help guide district decisions as measured by the tax levy and the budget vote
