



Proposed Budget: \$36,195,000

Increase from 22-23: \$1,216,500 (+3.48%) Proposed Tax Levy: \$13,200,000 (+2.75%)

Highlights:

- The proposed budget maintains all student programming and extracurricular activities.
- 2.75% levy increase (\$353,000) is within the district's tax cap of 2.8%.
- Separate propositions seek approval of \$12,000 funding increases each for the Elbridge and Jordan libraries.
- Voting Tuesday, May 16 from 7am-9pm at the JE High School Events Entrance.

Budget Highlights

- This budget supports all JE academic and co-curricular activities.
- Continues our practice of purchasing buses with cash.
- Expected aid on previous bus purchases (\$333,680) in 23-24.
- Anticipating increases in interest revenue on district reserve accounts.
- We continue to live in a period of high inflation Division of Budget forecasts 4.3-6.6% CPI increase for 2023-24.
- 2.75% Levy increase will provide \$353,000 of revenue to support student programming while remaining within the district tax cap limit.



Budget Highlights

- · Local businesses are expanding & hiring
- · The district is growing!
 - Two eight-unit townhouses (two bedrooms, 2.5 baths, 1,300 square feet home) are being constructed on Route 5 near Bailiwick
 - Cobblestone Ridge: two new homes built last year and two more planned for this year, with an additional twelve planned in the back of the property
 - Condominiums planned to be built on Route 5 next to Absolute Audio (also where Dimitri's Pizza is moving to, expanding their business and extending hours)
 - Sixteen new homes planned for construction in Jack's Reef on Old St. Route 31
- Onondaga County Verizon fiber optic high-speed internet in all county locations

The budget development process is led by the superintendent of schools (Jim Froio) in close association with the assistant superintendent for business and finance (RJ Hartwell). The needs of the students are translated into a budget by reviewing the needs as indicated by building principals, directors of technology, special education, and curriculum and instruction. These individuals assess the needs of students through observation in school buildings, measurements of test scores, and meetings with teachers and paraprofessionals. Measurements are both subjectively and objectively drawn through screening tools, formative and summative assessments, as well as community feedback from parents and district members. The budget process begins in December and concludes in June. It lasts approximately 7 months from initial planning to finalized end. Principals, teachers, board members, the superintendent, and assistant superintendent are involved in the budget development process. Members of the board of education meet as an audit committee to review budgetary items throughout the year. Principals and team leaders represent the needs of individual schools. The district does not use a formula to allocate funds to the school buildings in our district.

2. If applicable, is there anything unique about certain schools which explain why per pupil spending at these locations may be significantly higher/lower than the district average?

The middle school now consists of grades 4-8, which was reported differently in 20-21. The 4-5 grade program was connected to the elementary school in 20-21. It now has the same beds code and is reported with the middle school.

Additionally, the 21-22 school year was the year after the COVID closures, so additional funds were spent in trying to regain student achievement after very trying 2019-20 and 2020-21 years.

3. If applicable, describe any items which the district feels are anomalous in nature and require additional description.

The district feels there are no anomalous items at this time.





Proposed 2023-24 school budget aims to support a growing district community

On Tuesday, May 16th, Jordan-Elbridge Central School District residents will vote on a proposed \$36,195,000 budget for the 2023-24 school year. This budget represents a spending increase of 3.48 percent, or \$1,216,500 and carries a 2.75 percent tax levy increase.

This is only the third time in eight years that Jordan-Elbridge has presented a budget with a tax increase to voters. The proposed 2.75 percent tax levy increase falls below the district's legal limit as defined by New York's tax levy cap legislation. That means a simple majority (50 percent of votes plus one) is needed to approve the budget.

This year's proposed tax levy increase is necessary due to both a modest increase in state aid, and the continued rising costs of goods and services. Current high inflation not only impacts the groceries stocking the shelves of your local supermarket; but also, the cost of keeping lights on in

schools, the supplies students use in art and music classes, and the cost of health insurance for school employees.

"The school district's goal in developing a budget for the upcoming school year was to find the right balance between what our community can support and the cost of helping every student cultivate the BEST in personal growth and achievement," explained Superintendent of Schools James Froio.

Meet the new leadership team for JEMS & JEDIS

Jordan-Elbridge Middle School and the Jordan-Elbridge Dynamic Intermediate School will welcome a new leadership team in the 2023-24 school year, as current JEMS principal David Shafer prepares to retire.

Current International Baccalaureate Coordinator Alexis Farnsworth will become the principal for grades 4-8, overseeing both JEMS and JEDIS students. Current K-12 MTSS Coordinator Erin Wilson will become the dean of students for grades 4-8. Farnsworth's office will be in the middle school, while Wilson will be housed in the JEDIS wing of the building. Current JEDIS principal Nina Baker will continue her role as Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Intermediate Education.

Both Farnsworth and Wilson want parents, teachers, and students to understand that while JEMS and JEDIS will now share a principal, the curriculum and instruction at the two schools will remain separate. providing funding for additional assistant coaches for modified lacrosse, varsity softball, and varsity baseball.

Student safety continues to be a top priority at JE. Included in the proposed budget for the 2023-24 school year are additional enhancements to the security at Jordan-Elbridge High School.

The proposed spending plan also includes the purchase of two large and two small school buses.

The district will continue its practice of purchasing those buses with cash.

"We are celebrating some exciting news for the community: even though the proposed budget carries a tax levy increase, the district is also growing," said Assistant Superintendent of Schools, R.J. Hartwell. "This provides some relief to property tax impact the following year."

According to the Town of Elbridge supervisor, two eightunit townhouses are under construction near Bailiwick, Cobblestone Ridge development will continue this year, and plans to build new condominiums on Route 5 near Absolute Audio are in the works.

In addition to voting on the proposed budget, community members will elect three members to the Board of Education. See page two for further information.

Voters will also decide on two separate

propositions that would provide further funding for both the Elbridge Free Library and the Jordan Bramley Library.

Polls will be open on May 16th, 2023, from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. at JEHS. Voters may access the building via the events entrance.

Absentee ballots may be requested through the District Clerk. They must be returned by 5 p.m. on Tuesday, May 16th.

On the May 16 ballot

PROPOSITION 1: The 2023-24 budget

Shall the proposed 2023-24 budget for the Jordan-Elbridge Central School District, in the amount of \$36,195,000, as approved by the Board of Education on April 12th, 2023, be adopted?

What it means:

Voters in New York decide the spending plans for school districts. This proposition asks voters to decide whether to allow the district to spend up to \$36,195,000 for the 2023-24 school year.

What if the 2023-24 budget is not approved?

If voters reject the initial budget

proposal on May 16th, the Board of Education has the option of putting the same or a revised budget up for a revote in June. If a proposed budget is defeated twice by voters, the district must adopt a contingent budget.

Under New York's tax levy limit law, a contingent budget must carry a 0 percent tax levy increase. Contingency rules prohibit the district from spending money in certain areas, including the community's use of school facilities (unless the costs are reimbursed), field trips, new equipment (not related to the health and safety of students), non-essential maintenance, certain student supplies and small building improvement projects. The administrative component of the

budget would also be subject to certain restrictions.

PROPOSITION 2 & 3: Library Budgets

Voters will decide whether to allow the Elbridge Free Library and the Jordan Bramley Library to spend an additional \$12,000 in 2023-24.

JEHS student receives national recognition for art portfolio

Jordan-Elbridge High School student Emma Leiker is receiving national recognition for her art portfolio entitled "Contributions of Historical Women on the Advancement of American Society."
