Budget Highlights

- Reopens district buildings to the community and supports all co-curricular activities, clubs, 3-Year Old Pre-Kindergarten, fitness center, and Town of Elbridge Recreation Programs
- American Rescue Plan: \$2,126,000 federal stimulus; if received will fully fund Capital 2019 Reserve, decrease use of appropriated fund balance, and cover other unexpected COVID reopening expenses
- NY State's recent budget run estimates as much as \$2.8 million
- Reorganization of our administrative structure
- Replaced Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum & Instruction position with director position
- Added Assistant Superintendent of Business & Finance position and dropped payroll administrative aide in favor of a full time treasurer position
 - Overall savings due to these changes in 21-22 is \$45,495
- Addition of 1.0 FTE special education teacher, assistant positions & administrative aide in technology (overall savings of \$145,000)
- Continue purchasing buses with cash
- Expected aid on previous bus purchases (\$386,713) in 21-22
- Tax Cap = 1.43% = \$178,829
- Tax Rate Increase = 0.00%

JE Cares

In response to the pandemic, the JE School District has taken a larger role in the community

- Jordan-Elbridge has been one of the few districts that has remained open 5 days week to in-person instruction since September
- Since March 16, 2020, JE schools have provided 108,243 meals to district residents at no cost. Additionally, all students have been receiving free breakfast and lunch during the school day.
- Through donations from Peace Inc. totaling \$980,000 in value, we have distributed clothing to district residents and two neighboring school districts
- We provide consistent communication across the district through School Messenger phone calls and the JE Covid Hotline
- We have conducted asymptomatic testing for students
- In the near future, we will be providing on-site Covid vaccinations for high school students age 16 and older
- We have developed a budget that restores all programming to pre-Covid conditions
- All accomplished with a 0% tax levy increase
